=====overview

For your final group projects, you will be spending time interacting with the public and giving a demo of your projects. You will also need an attractive and interesting poster to draw people in. If you submit these posters to us by Monday 10 August, 5pm, they will be printed at no cost to you. If we do not have your file by then, you must print it yourself at a copy center of your choice (we will not cover the cost).

=====the assignment

- You must prepare a poster as either a single PDF that will print in a 30"x40" format (either horizontal or vertical).
- We highly recommend you use Adobe Illustrator or Adobe InDesign.
 - If you want, you can start with one of the following templates.
 - (Illustrator: [vertical](#) or [horizontal](#)) or (PPT: [vertical](#) or [horizontal](#))
 - They are only starting points – you have to decide on the final design and content of your poster. We highly recommend you put some time into personalizing the layout of your poster.
 - We recommend you DO NOT use non-standard fonts. We will not be able to install them on the machine we print from. However, if you DO choose to use non-standard fonts, you MUST make sure they are not text objects. To do this in Illustrator, right-click any text and select Create Outlines to convert it to a vector object that we can print. To save as PDF: File -> Save As -> select Adobe PDF
 - Use a white background so we don't run out of ink.
- The poster should contain the following main headings:
 - **Problem:** what you addressed
 - **Target User Group:** summarize the user group
 - **Solution:** describe your general approach—what tasks your app supports
 - **Design Evolution:** show some photos or diagrams indicating how the design changed.
 - **Final Prototype:** what it does and what was missing (i.e., what future work should address).
- The poster should contain images that illustrate your interface.

=====grading criteria

This assignment is worth 10 points. Including all the required information on your poster is worth 6 points, and the remaining 4 points will be based on the aesthetic appeal of your poster.

=====submission instructions

Poster designs must be submitted on bcourses as a PDF, one per group. Again, if they are submitted by Monday 10 August, 5pm, we will print them for you (for free), otherwise you must print them yourself and we will not cover the cost.

There is a hackster page for this assignment. You do not have to turn in your posters on hackster. However, if you would like to display them in the future as a part of your group's portfolio, you may upload them to the hackster page. **WE WILL NOT GRADE POSTERS SUBMITTED TO HACKSTER**, we will only grade posters submitted to bcourses.
